Old Major represents Karl Marx, Snowball represents Leon Trotsky, Napoleon represents Josef Stalin, Squealer represents propaganda, and Boxer is a representation for all the Russian laborers and workers."<sup>119</sup> In the mean while George Orwell wrote this work artistically, and shows political figures and revolution itself. Here, the readers are looking at The Russian Revolution and political figures objectively. Here the author not judging the revolution itself, every reader can judge them on their owns. This is what the satirists do pretty well. Giving a chance to be a referee or a judge like in the football games or acts. This also can impact on boosting to the critical thinking of the readers.

Another example: "1984" was written by G. Orwell. In this work usual characteristics of novel which controlled by the government. The local citizens of the country would not decide anything. They will accept of the decisions of the authority. Locals they do not have privacy at all and there is no place for love and privacy. Everywhere, everything controls by the cameras which are organized by the governments. It means people's mindsets also are controlled by the government. Spouse, professionalism or working place, dresses or even points to the people will choose by the authority. The citizens will live like robots. Here, the author shows us technological generations of the country. The readers or critics can see in this novel themselves. It is also problems of the present generations. Sometimes, they can not see them without the smartphones and Iphones. It is not arguable that technologies and cameras have positive impacts, but here author show another side of the technological developments. We should not depend on the IT totally, how "the author warns us against totalitarianism"<sup>120</sup>. Not all the things should be decided by the technologies. The satirists use different kind of stylistic devices such as grotesque, irony, allusion, alliteration, parody, exaggeration to describe characters or situations. From the sense of the descriptions of the animals, or people's name as animals' names could be. For example Evelyn Waugh's work in the "A Handful of Dusk", Mr John Beaver - descriptions and acts like the animal "Beaver" itself naturally. Showing the opposite characters to the Mr. Lasts' family. In this novel Evelyn Waugh shows the importance of the loyalty and value of the family in the personal's lives. Leaving a judgement to the readers from the works. Usually, the
