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# THE ROLE OF NIZOMIDDIN KHOJAYEV IN THE JADID MOVEMENT

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### Annotation

This article provides an in-depth analysis of the role, activities, and influence of Nizomiddin Asomiddinovich Khojayev in the Jadid movement. It also highlights N.
